
Note: The work in this position will require a year-round approach and eliminates any break in meeting the needs of the parents, students, school and community. The 12-month position presents a more competitive salary range than that of a 10-month position, and the instructional aspect, while not actually teaching in a classroom, is a very integral part of the overall concept of the job. Also, since the position would be salaried and fall under the exempt status, overtime pay would not be a concern.








How informed did you feel about the special programs in Virginia Beach BEFORE this presentation?








How informed did you feel about the special programs in Virginia Beach AFTER this presentation?








What are your initial thoughts on receiving information at your community center?
